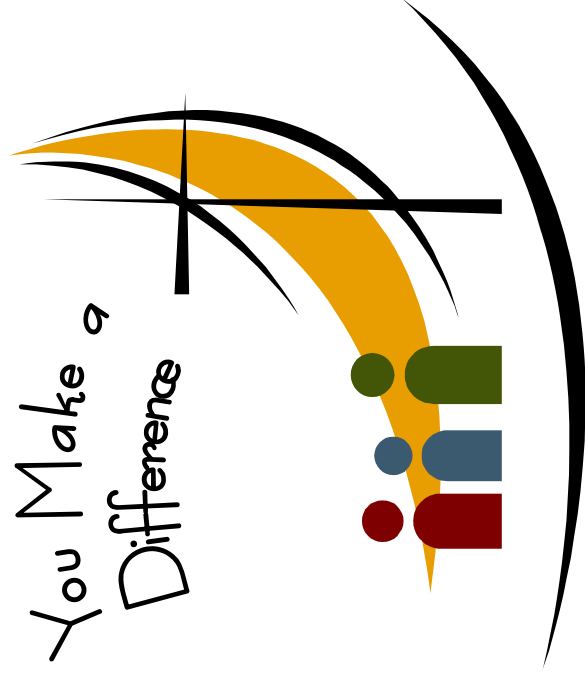

## NURSERY MINISTRIES

- 1 Nursery Information Greeter**  
Welcome parents and children to the nursery on Sunday mornings, assist them in finding appropriate nursery age-level classrooms and answer any questions about the nursery.
- 2 8:30 a.m. Nursery Volunteer**  
Volunteer workers arrive to assigned nursery room at 8:00 a.m. to serve as loving caregivers to children, birth through Pre-K. Assist the workers and other volunteers to provide a safe, happy environment.
- 3 9:45 a.m. Nursery Volunteer**  
Volunteer workers assist the workers and Sunday school teachers during the Worship and Sunday school hour. Help with snacks and crafts with toddlers through Pre-K and rocking or feeding babies.
- 4 11:00 a.m. Nursery Volunteer**  
Volunteer workers arrives to the assigned nursery by 10:45 a.m. to serve as a loving caregiver to children birth through Pre-K. .
- 5 Celebrate Cornerstone Babies**  
Visit parents to welcome the new baby and to offer support and encouragement. Volunteers will also deliver a gift basket from the church family and put up a yard sign to announce the baby's birth.
- 6 2 Year Old Sunday School Teacher**  
Interact with 2-year-olds through play and a short bible lesson. Class room materials and suggestion for play will be provided.



## CHILDREN'S MINISTRIES

- 7 Pre-K Sunday School Teacher** Prepare and teach a Bible lesson from approved curriculum and teach children between ages 3 and 5 years. The Children's Director provides resource materials and teacher training.
- 8 Elementary Age Sunday School Teacher**  
Prepare and teach a Bible lesson from approved curriculum and teach children between Kindergarten and Sixth Grade. Materials provided and teacher training. Children in this age group receive their first Bible from the Church and you will have the honor of teaching them the stories from God's Holy Word.
- 9 Sunday School Teacher Substitute**  
To be available to sub for a teacher on Sunday Mornings for the Pre-K and elementary age children.
- 10 Wee Worship Children's Church**  
Study, plan and prepare to teach children how to worship God through the use of kid-friendly object lessons, music, prayer, puppets, scripture verses, offering, etc. Serve as a leader & teacher, puppeteer, prayer partner, music leader. This is a one month rotation commitment.
- 11 Kids ConneXion Children's Church**  
Join this Ministry Team and use you gifts and talents to teach children how to worship God through praise songs, prayer, scripture, offering, and support of missions. Children's Church allows kids to enter into worship and praise and to hear God's message. Two moth rotation commitment.
- 12 Sunday Morning Special Buddy**  
This is a chance to be one on one help with our children with special needs. You will grow in a special relationship by being a child's buddy for Sunday Morning to guide them and show Christ's love.



**13 Operate Sound System for Kids**  
**ConneXion services**

Be trained to oversee the music sound-board during children's services.

**14 Worship Guest for Children's Church**

Come to Children's Church once a month or quarter to play musical instruments, tell a story, or teach sign language scripture verses.

**15 Greetings for Kids**

Get involved with kids by sending out cards for children's birthdays, get well, missing you, etc. Cards and postage will be provided.

***VBS DATE: June 22nd—25th***

**16 Vacation Bible School Leadership Team**

Commit to serve on the Leadership VBS Team. Leaders begin work 3 – 4 months before the VBS week in June. You will receive your Leader's Book early and then will work with a dedicated group of volunteers to plan the activities for the area you are leading.

**17 VBS Drama worker**

Assist with stories, sets and costumes.

**18 VBS Skit Worker**

Assist with opening and closing skits.

**19 VBS Music Worker**

Assist with music during VBS.

**20 VBS Snacks Worker**

Assist with snacks during VBS.

**21 VBS Crew Leaders for Children** Assist with a small group during VBS.

**22 VBS Hospitality Crew**

Prepare snack table and provide assistance for VBS workers.

**23 VBS Crafts Worker**

Assist with crafts during VBS.

**24 VBS Recreation Worker**

Assist with recreational activities during VBS.

**25 VBS Registration Worker**

You will be keeping track of children and volunteers.

**26 VBS Set-up and Break-Down Crew**

2 hour commitment on Sunday afternoon and Thursday night.

**27 Photographer for Children's Special Events**

Help capture church events such as VBS, Easter Egg Hunt, Fall Hayride, children's musical, etc. Submit photographs to the church office to use in the Cornerstone Chronicle.

**28 Set Decorator for Children's Special Events**

Creative volunteers are needed to help build, paint, decorate for VBS, children's musicals and other events.

**29 Missions Coordinator for Children's Church and Sunday School**

Help Cornerstone children to share the love of Jesus with others by introducing missions and missionaries during children's church and Sunday school.

**30 Bulletin Boards and Special Decorations for Children's Ministries**

Use your talents and creativity to decorate children's classrooms and bulletin boards for Christmas, Easter and other special seasons of the year.

**31 Spring Program - "Sunday Night Live"**

Serve as a leader or assistant to plan weekly programs to include Bible drama, music, crafts, recreation, and snack supper. You are encouraged to invite others to participate in this community outreach program.

**32 Fall Program – Christmas Musical**

Serve as a leader or assistant to plan weekly programs to include music, recreation, snack supper, and more! Cornerstone families are encouraged to invite others to participate in this Community outreach program.

**33 Easter Egg Hunt**

Help organize this special activity for children and their families. The Easter Story, arts & crafts, candy eggs & treats, refreshments or family picnic are just a few of the ideas that may be used for this event.

- 34 **Harvest Festival** Help plan and organize this event for children and the whole church family. Fellowship supper, hay ride, games are some of the ideas you might use. Be creative to use your talents in providing a safe environment for kids and parents to have fun.
- 35 **Acolyte Trainer and Coordinator** Coordinate and ensure that acolytes are trained and understand the symbolism of bringing God's Light into the worship service. Maintain the tapers and candle wicks. Make sure acolytes are present, properly robed, and on time for the service. Acolyte schedule will be provided by the Children's Director.
- 36 **Snacks for Children's events** Join in preparing and / or providing simple snacks on Sunday nights for the Fall and Spring children's programs.
- 37 **Girls of Grace:** Needed are at least Two individual that would be will to help lead a 10 week summer bible study for girls in the age group of 2nd grade thru 6th grade.

## INSIDE OUT YOUTH MINISTRIES

- 38 **Sunday School Teacher for Youth at 8:30** Teach a class for Jr. High students or a class for Sr. High students on Sunday mornings. You may choose to teach alone or work with a team of adults on a rotation bases.
- 39 **Sunday School Teacher for Youth at 11:00** Teach a class for Jr. High students or a class for Sr. High students on Sunday mornings. You may choose to teach alone or work with a team of adults on a rotation basis.
- 40 **Sunday Night Youth Counselor** Inside-Out Youth meets from 5:30pm-7:30pm during the school year on Sundays. There's food, games, and of course Bible study. This year we will focus on how we make a difference in other's lives. Your job will be to love the youth and walk with them on their journey through this time of their lives.
- 41 **Wednesday Night Youth Counselor** This year we will be have a mid-week youth gathering at church. We will be meeting the 2nd and 4th Wednesday of each month. We need your help!
- 42 **Youth Taxi Driver** There always youth that need a ride to youth. Are you willing to be a taxi for them?
- 43 **Ozark Mission Project Adult Driver** Help transport, travel with and work with the youth on this project. "This will be one of the most rewarding experiences of your life!"
- 44 **Host Ozark Mission Project Camp at Cornerstone Shower House** For one week on the summer our church host an OMP camp. You will be asked to providing a place for them to come shower each afternoon.
- 45 **OMP Partner** We need help packing lunches, making desserts, and filling goody bags.
- 46 **Provide Snack Supper for Youth Group** Prepare and/or provide snack supper on Sunday nights for the youth group.
- 47 **Friday Night 5th Quarter** After home football games we will open the church up for the youth to come and hang out. We need people to provide food, set up for basketball, and basically hang out with the youth!

**48 Senior Banquet**

Help with planning, decorating and preparing for the banquet for graduating high school seniors.

## COLLEGE MINISTRIES

**49 Wesley Campus Ministry**

Help with "Welcome to ASU" gift bags, Survival Kits for Finals, Invite Wesley students and other students to worship with us on Sundays. Bake cookies, phone students who are away from home.

**50 C.O.R.E. Sunday Morning Class**

Tell others about this class and support this group for college/career age young adults.

## CHURCH & SOCIETY

**51 State & Global Missions Team**

Do you have a heart for missions? Help Cornerstone become more focused on outreach into the world by supplying us with information about our missionaries and about opportunities for us to help throughout the year with various mission projects. Help with the Glorious Giving Market. Gather information, encourage participation in, and perhaps plan volunteer in mission trips. Pray for our missionaries and for those in need.

**52 City Youth**

Volunteer to work with youth from Jonesboro on one Friday night of the month or any other time that this Ministry Team could help at the Center. All types of jobs and activities are possible. Investing time in the life of a young person is a positive way to share the blessings that God has given you.

**53 Easter Sew-In**

Assist in providing Easter clothing for needy children in the Jonesboro area.

**54 Radical Acts of Kindness** This group will be reaching out to the nearby community with acts of love and being lead by the Holy Spirit through prayer.

**55 Angel Bags**

Provide the Salvation Army with gifts to help provide Christmas gifts for needy children. Coordinate with the Salvation Army to decide how many Angel Bags Cornerstone will be expected to fill, and when the bags are to be returned.

**56 School Kits**

Coordinate the collection of school supplies; organize and distribute the supplies to selected schools in the fall and spring.

**57 Women's Shelter**

Plan, organize, and publicize ways that Cornerstone members can support the residents of the local Women's Shelter. Get the whole church involved in collecting items that are needed at the shelter. Some volunteers may also want to help at the Women's Shelter.

**58 Helping Neighbors Food Pantry**

Inform the congregation of items to be brought for the Food Pantry and provide a place in the church for food collection. Volunteer to work at the Food Pantry in two hour shifts. Volunteers help fill bags with nutritious foods for needy people in the community.

**59 Baking Cookies**

Bake cookies and deliver them to the various Fire Departments and Police Departments in the community. Offer cookies, other foods, and drinks to fire fighters or police, following a tragedy or accident that involved their community of workers.

**60 Ingathering**

Each Fall we take items that have been gathered throughout the year to St. Paul UMC to be distributed to those in need. Volunteers for this ministry would help to gather those items and deliver them to St. Paul UMC.

# VOLUNTEER

- 61 **United Methodist Women**  
Participate in ministry with other women of the church in one of the UMW groups. They meet monthly for fellowship and worship, through devotionals, missions, programs, and community service projects.

- 62 **Men's Small Groups**  
Join a weekly gathering of 2-5 men to encourage, affirm and support each other in spiritual growth and in walking with Jesus Christ. Through mutual accountability we are able to live out Proverbs 27:17 which states "iron sharpens iron."

- 63 **Blood Drive Worker**  
Volunteers assist the Red Cross to ensure that the blood drives run smoothly; they arrange time, place, and organize workers and volunteers to provide snacks.

- 64 **Blood Donor**  
Cornerstone has six blood drives per year. Volunteers should donate blood four or more times per year.

- 65 **Prayer Shawl Ministry**  
Use your gifts and talents to crochet or knit items that would give comfort and wrap someone in God's love--shawls, baby blankets, chemo caps for persons undergoing treatment for cancer, lap blanket, etc. Persons are needed to teach others how to knit or crochet. This group can meet together monthly for fellowship and to pray for those individuals for whom the gifts are made.

- 66 **Country Fair & Auction**  
Help plan, organize, and publicize the activities and events for the Country Fair. Chairpersons and workers are needed for Tickets, Silent Auction, Arts and Crafts, Kids Alley, Bazaar and Breakfast, Antiques and Collectibles, Barbeque Dinner, and more. This event is popular with the community and involves active participation by the whole church family.

## Prayer Works



### PRAYER MINISTRIES

- 67 **Prayer Chain**  
Become a link in the circle of church members, joined together and committed to pray for specific and urgent needs, at any time of day, as they are brought to our attention.
- 68 **Intercessory Prayer** Needed are prayer warriors that are willing to pray in the prayer room during each worship service and come and pray with individuals upon request.
- 69 **Men's Prayer Breakfast**  
Join this group of men who meet on Wednesday mornings at 6:45 a.m. for PRAYER, fellowship, and breakfast.

### ADMINISTRATIVE MINISTRIES

- 70 **Church Office**  
Assist in the church office with such jobs as answering the phone, secretarial jobs, registering of attendance, helping in the preparation of the church bulletin, the monthly newsletter, In His Steps materials and with the preparation of the Worship Center for services.
- 71 **Sanctuary Steward**  
The sanctuary needs to be a pleasant place for worship and the people who volunteer for this ministry will be making sure the chairs are clean and in good shape, that offering envelopes and pencils are in the chair backs, and that there are Bibles and hymnals distributed evenly.

**72 Equipment/Furniture Breakdown**  
Be available to help with the set-ups that are needed for church functions such as fellowship dinners, VBS, the District Conference and all activities that require moving furniture and chairs for other special events.

**73 Church Library**  
Assist the church librarian in maintaining the library, including book selection, processing books, circulation, promotion and general maintenance of equipment.

**74 Church Pictorial Directory**  
Serve as host and work with Olan Mills coordinating dates and times for our next church pictorial directory. This will take place some time during the Spring of 2009.

**75 Transportation by Bus**  
Operate church bus as needed. Drivers must be 21 years of age or older. Drivers are needed on a regular basis to transport people to and from church on Sunday, Special Services and other activities as needed. Drivers are also needed at various times to transport children, youth, and adults to midweek programs, Bible studies, worship services, fellowship dinners, music programs, etc.

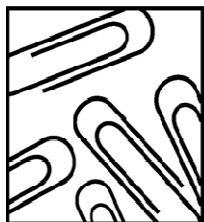
**76 Church Grounds**  
Use your talents to help beautify the island at the entry to Disciple Drive and with the existing flowerbeds. Plan for future landscaping. Help weed, mulch, and prune plants to keep them looking their best. Help maintain the church grounds, shrubbery, and flowers to look cared for all year round.



**77 Fellowship / New Member Dinner**  
Fellowship Dinners and New Members Dinners are planned quarterly. Use your talents to help with one or more of the following jobs: plan the meal, shop for groceries, prepare food, organize for set-up, decorations, clean up, publicize time, place, and menu. Be creative in getting the whole church involved and encourage Cornerstone members to invite someone new.

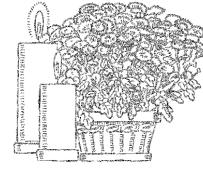
**78 Welcome New Members**  
Provide encouragement and support for a new member/family. This team will help match new members with a church family or individual. Our goal is to help each new member become familiar with all ministries and activities at Cornerstone. Introduce them to others, invite them to Sunday School, tell them about In His Steps, and sit with them at Fellowship Dinners and at the New Members Dinner.

**79 Hospital Ministry**  
Visit Cornerstone members, friends, and others who are in the hospital. Offer prayer, encouragement, and support to the patient and his/her family. Cornerstone members work in pairs as they visit members and friends in the hospital.

## WORSHIP MINISTRIES



### WORSHIP Ministries

#### 80 **Church Attendance / Follow Up**

Keep up with church attendance for the purpose of noticing when a member or family is absent due to illness, accidents, or family crisis. Members of this ministry contact families by phone, cards, and other means to let them know that they are missed.

#### 81 **Bake or Deliver Bread**

Help welcome visitors to Cornerstone by baking a loaf of fresh bread! Adults are needed to bake the bread, and/or to deliver the bread with a church coffee mug to first time visitors at Cornerstone.

#### 82 **Congregational Care Ministry**

Provide encouragement and support of church members and their families in times of long-term illness, accidents, or other family crisis and also in times of celebration (birth of a new baby, wedding showers, etc.) Alert others in the congregation and/or Sunday School classes to help by taking food, and/or providing companionship and assist as needed to help hostess a social activity.

#### 83 **Special Congregational Celebrations Ministry**

– Volunteers are needed to ensure that our church celebrates a new baby or a new bride with showers, coordinate other small congregational celebrations.

#### 84 **Flower Delivery Ministry**

Deliver sanctuary flowers to shut-ins, nursing home residents, or members in local hospitals or to those who are sick and at home. Flowers are to be delivered on Sunday or Monday.

#### 85 **Golf Ministry**

Be a witness for Christ on the golf course! Men and women are invited to join this group on the second Tuesday of the month at 12:00 p.m. in winter months and at 1:00 p.m. in summer months. Enjoy wonderful fellowship, make new friends, and invite others to join in playing golf with Cornerstone members.

#### 86 **Communion Stewards 8:30**

Prepare the elements for communion. Assist the pastor in serving the sacrament during the first Sunday of every month.

#### 87 **Communion Stewards 9:45**

Prepare the elements for communion. Assist the pastor in serving the sacrament during the first Sunday of every month.

#### 88 **Communion Stewards 11:00**

Prepare the elements for communion. Assist the pastor in serving the sacrament during the first Sunday of every month.

#### 89 **Take Communion to Homebound**

Deliver and administer the sacrament of Holy Communion to those who are unable to attend the worship services. Check with the church office each month for new names that may need to receive Communion for that month.

#### 90 **Liturgist at 8:30 Service**

Lead the Order of Worship for the 8:30 service. Liturgists should prepare prior to the service through prayer, study of the scriptures, and study of the church bulletin. Must communicate with the pastor and music director before the service begins.

#### 91 **Liturgist at 9:45 Service**

Lead the Order of Worship for the 9:45 service. Liturgists should prepare prior to the service through prayer, study of the scriptures, and study of the church bulletin. Must communicate with the pastor and music director before the service begins.

**92 Liturgist at 11:00 Service**

Lead the Order of Worship for the 11:00 service. Liturgists should prepare prior to the service through prayer, study of the scriptures, and study of the church bulletin. Must communicate with the pastor and music director before the service begins.

**93 Usher / Greeter 8:30**

Serve with a group of people each Sunday Morning whose goal is to welcome and receive visitors and members into God's House for all Worship Services. During training for this ministry team, you may choose to work in all areas of this ministry or just the areas you feel comfortable with. Example: Greeting outside and/or inside, distribution of bulletins, taking the offering, ushering during the communion service). One Ministry Leader will be assigned for this team and he/she will coordinate the roles of each team member.

**94 Usher / Greeter 9:45** Description for this Ministry Team is the same as for the 8:30 service. Special Services include Christmas Eve Service, New Year's Eve Service, Cantatas at Christmas and Easter, as well as others.

**95 Usher / Greeter 11:00** Description for this Ministry Team is the same as for the 8:30 service. Special Services include Christmas Eve Service, New Year's Eve Service, Cantatas at Christmas and Easter, as well as others.

**96 Altar Preparation, Paraments**

Prepare the altar table for worship each week. Keep appropriate liturgical colors on the altar and lectern. Coordinate special decorations to reflect the seasonal liturgical year. Coordinate and establish a schedule for church members, visitors, and friends to provide flower arrangements for the altar table. Maintain the condition of the cross, candles, and other altar ware.

**97 Operate Sound & Lighting 8:30**

Be trained in the operation of all equipment used in the worship service.

**98 Operate Sound & Lighting 9:45**

Be trained in the operation of all equipment used in the worship service.

**99 Operate Sound & Lighting 11:00**

Be trained in the operation of all equipment used in the worship service.

**100 Operate Computer Equipment 8:30** Keep the PowerPoint presentation slides in sync to lead the worship service. Practice with the Praise Team as often as needed.

**101 Operate Computer Equipment 9:45** Keep the PowerPoint presentation slides in sync to lead the worship service.

**102 Operate Computer Equipment 11:00** Keep the PowerPoint presentation slides in sync to lead the worship service.

## ARTS AND MUSIC MINISTRIES

**Mission Statement**

*The art and music ministries reach out through music and the other arts to share the Word of God in worship and with each other in a community of fellowship.*

**103 Worship Team Singers 8:30**

If you love to sing to the Lord, come join this group and lend your voice in leading the congregation in songs of worship. Rehearsals are held on Wednesday evenings for all members of the worship Team.

**104 Praise Team Singers 9:45**

If you love to sing to the Lord, come join this group and lend your voice in leading the congregation in songs of praise and worship. Rehearsals are held on Wednesday evenings for all members of the worship Team.

**105 Instrumentalists and Accompanists**

Use your gifts and talents to help lead music in the worship service. Guitars, keyboards, drums, piano, strings and brass instruments. Instruments are used throughout all three services Rehearsals are on Wednesday evening.

**106 Chancel Choir 11:00** Lift your voice in songs to the Lord and lead the congregation in worship. Rehearsals weekly on Wednesday evenings. Child care available.

**107 Christmas & Easter Musicians** Join with others to prepare for these special worship services by playing an instrument or singing in one of our choral groups. Attend all rehearsals.

**108 Handbell Ringers** If you have ever played in a bell choir or wanting to learn, we will offer 2 levels of hand bell participation. Beginning bell for new ringers or those that do not read music. A more advanced choir who wish to have more of a challenge.

**109 Mission Choir** Our mission choir will be in service to the community, Made up of volunteers who can go during the day. We hope to spread God's love and cheer to those in our nursing homes through music. Great singing voice is NOT a requirement but a good spirit, enjoyment of music and willingness to share with others is.

**110 Children's Choirs** Our children's choirs are part of our children's ministry on Sunday evening during the fall and spring semesters. Volunteer to help with this ministry.



**111 Youth Music** Cornerstone youth are invited to be a part of any of the music and arts ministries of the church.

**112 Liturgical Dance** If you are a dance, please share your talents through liturgical dance. Liturgical dancer interpret music and scripture through movement.

**113 Art** Are you an artist and willing to share your talents? Please sign up for this!

**114 Drama** Dramatic reading, skits, and other forms of drama can be used to enhance our worship as we share God's love through action and word.



**BIBLE STUDIES**

**115 Disciple 1** - Participate in a 34-week transformational Bible study that covers from Creation to the New Jerusalem. The class meets for a short 2 ½ hours each week. This Bible study features small-group discussion of Scripture based on careful study and preparation. Disciple Groups normally begin in the Fall and Spring semesters.

**116 Disciple 2** - Participate in a 32-week study of Genesis-Exodus and Luke-Acts. This study teaches basic study skills for going deeper into the Scriptures and links Bible study to witness and service in the world. Calls for evaluating and reordering life's priorities in response to God's call. Classes begin in the fall, spring and/or as soon as a group of 12-16 forms. Disciple I must be completed before taking any of the other Disciple Bible studies.

**117 Disciple 3** - Participate in a 32-week study of the Prophets and Paul's Letters. This study sets the Prophets and Paul's writings in historical and geographical context. The study understands Bible study as a call to repentance – to turn life toward God. Classes begin in the fall, and Disciple I must be completed before taking any of the other Disciple Bible studies.

**118 Disciple 4** - Participate in a 32-week study of the Writings (Old Testament books not in the Torah or the prophets), the Gospel of John, and Revelation. Classes begin in the fall, and If you think you already know everything about Jesus, you'll definitely want to be a part of this class. Disciple I must be completed before taking any of the other Disciple Bible studies.

**119 Jesus in the Gospels** - Participate in a 30-week study that focuses the portraits of Jesus found in the four Gospels. This study looks at the way each Gospel writer presents events and teachings and at the picture of Jesus that emerges in each of the Gospels. Participants in this study must have completed Disciple I and one of the other Disciple studies.

**120 Christian Believer** - Participate in a 30-week study that integrates Bible study and Christian doctrine. Christian Believer invites participants to learn or re-learn the language of the Christian faith through words, symbols and songs. Classes begin in the fall, spring and/or as soon as a group of 12 –16 forms. No previous classes are required.

**121 Kingdom People** - Participate in an eight week study of how our lives can be transformed from casual Christian to complete Christian. The quest to become a Kingdom Person is a lifelong journey with God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit. Join a small group today to experience God's blessings as He reveals His Word to you. No previous classes required.

**122 Short-term Bible Studies** - Cornerstone strives to offer many kinds of Bible Studies throughout the year. Choosing to study God's Word with a small group of Christian brothers and sisters is a step in choosing to grow in discipleship.

**123 Emmaus Walk** - Emmaus is an inter-denominational Christian community that prepares believers for service and leadership in their local churches. Participants spend a weekend at a camp near Jonesboro. Those who have taken "walks" can volunteer to help in future "walks". For more information, call the church office or talk with Ron Clines or the many other Cornerstone members who have taken the 'Walk to Emmaus'.

## Vision Ministries

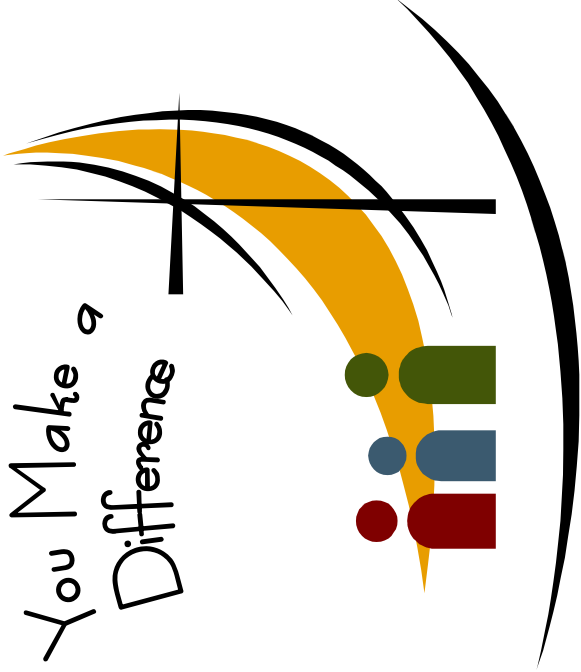
